Good Practice	Socioeducational Intervention Model: Community Marathon on Migration
Description	The Community Marathon on Migration was a model implemented by the IOM Honduras Western Hemisphere Program (WHP) to strengthen the capacities of local counterparts and young individuals in the area of preventing irregular migration. Simultaneously, it promoted informed decision-making and the creation of trusted spaces for reflecting upon the migration phenomenon. In the capacity-building stage for local partners, a neuroscience approach was employed, while community implementation utilized resources from the “Educational Toolkit” platform (repository of educational materials on migration) and the Communication for Development (C4D) campaign. “Piénsalo 2 Veces” .
Objective	Ensuring the learning of young individuals about the risks of irregular migration and the process of regular migration, while simultaneously fostering reflection on the migration phenomenon.
Location	Honduras. Central District: Tegucigalpa, Comayagüela and Valle de Amaratéca. San Pedro Sula: Rivera Hernández Neighborhood. Ocotepeque: La Labor.
Beneficiaries	112 trained facilitators (technical staff from implementing partners, teachers from educational networks, and community leaders). 2440 empowered young individuals. 2574 participants in community outreach activities.
